The focusing screen is in good condition, the camera accepts 61/4 x 4 1/2 inch plates. There are three wooden film plate holders included. The back can be rotated. The lens fitted is a Kodak Ektar 203mm f7.7 370 mount with Kodak hood. The shutters are Prontor-SVS B 1-300. There is a cable shutter release. Viewfinders and bubble levels are positioned for horizontal and vertical use. It has an extending focussing bellows. The brass lens is a No.2 Stigmatic series 11 patent No.64813 manufactured by P.H Dallmeyer. London.Shutters are Bausch and Lomb Automat TB 1-100 f6-f45. There is a Ivorine camera makers plate inside the lens housing, " G.HARE Manufacturer 25 Calthorpe St. London" A leather case is included; it is in need of some re-stitching.
